## Art Tested Experience Rubric

The tested experience rubric is designed to establish situations where someone who may not hold a master's degree in art may be allowed to teach for the Pikes Peak State College Art Department.

An individual with a master's degree in an ART related field (graphic design, illustration, art education which are not usually ART degrees) can be eligible to teach a core class (Drawing, 2D Design, 3D Design, Art Appreciation) if they meet 6 points on the rubric below.

An individual with a bachelor's degree in an ART related field (graphic design, illustration, art education which are not usually ART degrees) who scores at least six points on the below rubric may be eligible to teach non-core ART courses (such as Jewelry Making, Stained Glass, Watercolor, etc.).
