\$41,290

PPCC Accounting graduates may earn on average \$41,290 a year. In Colorado, the median hourly salary in 2018 for Bookkeeping, Accounting, and Auditing Clerks was \$20.11, with a salary range of \$12.14-\$29.64. From 2016 to 2026, there are expected to be an average of 3,300 job openings per year in Colorado, an increase of 2%. Source: Bureau of Labor Statistics.
