Degree with Designation:

The Degree with Designation is designed to allow you to graduate from a Colorado community college with a 60-credit Associate of Arts (AA) or Associate of Science (AS) degree, enroll with junior status at a Colorado university and complete a bachelor's degree in no more than an additional 60 credits (for a total of 120 credits).
