

EdReady is a personalized, free, and self-paced learning system that is used to assess students' English and Math readiness for Pikes Peak placement. You can complete EdReady on-line from the comfort of your home.

To take advantage of this option, you will need to:

- Go to <https://pikespeak.edready.org/home> and create an account.
 - Use your Pikes Peak assigned student email if you have one. If you do not have a Pikes Peak e-mail, you should use the e-mail you included in your Pikes Peak application.
 - Only scores from the Pikes Peak EdReady Platform will be accepted for placement. You will know if you are in the Pikes Peak Platform if you see the PPSC logo.
- Enter the Goal Key for the course you are trying to place into. See the chart below for a list of the PPSC EdReady Goal Keys (aka Private Keys).

MAT 1440 Pre-Calculus	PPSC_1440	EdReady NO longer valid for Pre-Calculus after Sep 3, 2024.	Use this code as a study tool before taking the Accuplacer AAF Test.

After Fall 2026 registration closes, EdReady will no longer be valid for placement into **MAT 1340** College Algebra.

Starting September 4, 2024, EdReady will no longer be valid for placement into **MAT 1440** Pre-Calculus.

- After adding the goal key, you will then complete the diagnostic test, work through the lessons, and retake sections/unit tests to earn your target score. A score of 90 is required for placement into college level English classes; a score of 100 is required for placement into college level Math classes. A score less than 90, for English, and less than 100 for Math, will place you into co-req or college prep courses.
 - Students using TA, VA, or MyCAA education benefits should take EdReady once and submit that score to the Testing Center.** VA, TA, and MyCAA benefits will not pay for developmental classes (below 1000 level) if students force a score of 90+ for English, or 100 for Math on EdReady. Students using TA, VA, or MyCAA education benefits who earned a score of 90+ for English, or 100 for Math, will have to pay out of pocket if they later realize they need the developmental class(es). - Once you have earned the target score, the Testing Center will get an automatic notification with your score report. The Testing Center will process your score and will send you an e-mail with placement information within two business days.
- Students using TA, VA, and MyCAA education benefits may use EdReady with a score below 90 for English, and below 100 for Math, to justify enrollment in co-requisite or prep courses. To do that, students must export their results directly to the Testing Center following these steps:
 - Go to "My Account".
 - Under "Student data export" select "Download your Data".
 - In the textbox, enter the Testing Center email address: Testing.Center@PikesPeak.edu. Click Send.
 - The Testing Center will process your scores within two business days.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. **How do I know what EdReady goal key to take/use?**

Use the specific goal key for the class you are trying to get into. If you are not sure what class you should take for your major, meet with an advisor.

2. **How many times can I retake and EdReady goal key assessment?**

You can only take the initial assessment once. After that, you may work through the lessons and retake topic and unit tests as many times as needed to earn a score of 90 for English, or 100 for Math, for college level placement. Doing so, may not be in your best interest if you are using VA, TA, or MyCAA education benefits, please contact MVP for more information (719-502-4100, MVP@PikesPeak.edu).

3. **Do I have to pay for EdReady?**

There are no fees involved with using EdReady for Placement.

4. **How long do I need to wait to keep working on the EdReady Study Path?**

You do not need to wait to continue your work, you should spend time working through the lessons to improve your skills.

5. **What is the minimum score to earn placement?**

You must earn 90 to place into college level English classes.

You must score 100 to place into college level Math classes.

6. **Do I need to send my EdReady scores to the Testing Center?**

The Testing Center will get automatic notifications when you reach a score of 90 or higher for English, and 100 for Math. You do not need to manually send your scores. If you score below the target score and are planning to use VA Education Benefits or Tuition Assistance to pay for college prep courses, you must manually send your scores to the Testing Center:

- Go to “My Account”.
- Under “Student data export” select “Download your Data”.
- In the textbox, enter the Testing Center email address: Testing.Center@PikesPeak.edu. Click Send.
- The Testing Center will let you know when your scores have been entered on your student record.

7. **Can I use my EdReady scores to transfer to another college?**

No, at this time EdReady can only be used for placement at Pikes Peak State College.
