

## Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) Program Cost Outline

### 1. Tuition & Fees

- Cost per NUR credit hour
  - Resident: \$370.40
  - Non-Resident: \$710
- Total estimated tuition (1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> year with a total of 56.5 credits)
  - Resident: \$19,733.40
  - Non-Resident: \$39,892.40
- Mandatory college fees (e.g., technology, student services, course fees)
  - First Year: \$754.41
  - Second Year: \$687.26

### 2. Course Materials & Supplies

- Textbooks (estimated cost per year):
  - First Year: \$1,468.88
  - Second Year: \$1,325.84
- Online learning resources (Docucare, ATI testing Materials, etc.): \$1,356.27

### 3. Clinical & Lab Fees

- Lab equipment usage fees: \$1,415.62
- Clinical site requirements: \$1,612.02

### 4. Exam & Licensing Costs

- NCLEX-RN exam fee: \$200
- Background check & fingerprinting: \$30-\$75
- Colorado Licensing application fees: \$123

### 5. Additional Expenses

- Health requirements (vaccinations, TB test, Tdap, MMR, etc): \$760
- CPR certification: \$60-\$80

    - Resident: \$12,793.54
    - Non-Resident: \$21,321.94
- Grand total estimate
