
What are PFAS?

Per-and polyfluoroalkyl substances, a group of chemicals used to make coatings and products that resist heat, oil, grease, & water.

Also known as "forever chemicals."

Are PFAS Dangerous?

PFAS are a public health concern
because they are persistent. They have
been shown to cause an increase in
the risk of certain health problems
such as High Blood Pressure,
Cholesterol, Kidney and Testicular
Cancers. Additionally, they have
been linked to damage in the Liver
and Immune System.



More than a hundred drinking water sources across Colorado — ranging from cities and counties to elementary schools and campgrounds — contain what are now considered to be potentially hazardous levels of PFAS, toxic "forever chemicals" linked to a slew of health problems, data from 2020 shows.
